MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS:

1. a) Completed Basic Specialist Training (BST) carried out overseas or conducted by the Postgraduate Advisory Training Board (PGATB), Ministry of Health and achieved Membership of the Royal College of Physicians/Surgeons (MRCP, MRCS, FRCAn, MRCOG, MRCPeds) or its equivalent recognised by the Government of His Majesty the Sultan and Yang Di Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam or attained Professional Masters (Medicine) or its equivalent recognised by the Government of Brunei Darussalam.

OR

- b) Completed BST conducted by PGATB, Ministry of Health in the relevant discipline recognised by the Government of Brunei Darussalam and passed MOH Internal Assessment (Basic) and have worked with the Government of Brunei Darussalam as Medical Officer Grade I (MD.16A) for not less than five (5) years.
